

## Lesson 2: The Interview

### Facts and Information – Flammable Liquids

- Males aged 10 – 29 make up almost half of the burn and scald injuries caused by highly flammable materials, e.g. petrol.
- 69% of all burn related injuries result in a 1 – 3 day hospital stay.
- 49% of full thickness burns are due to clothes catching on fire.

#### Option 1

Use the consequences and information sheets to create an interview with Paul's family or friends about what life has been like for them since Paul was burnt. Present it as an online news article.

**Entry 2:** In rehabilitation learning how to use his body again.

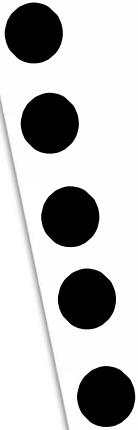
**Entry 3:** How he is coping at home after rehabilitation.
