Recruiting consumers to help test a resource for inpatient care of low vision and blind patients

The NSW Agency for Clinical Innovation (ACI) is developing NSW's first resource to improve the experience for blind and low vision in-patients in public hospitals. The project is in a development and testing phase, due for completion in December 2020.

If you are **blind or have low vision** and have been an **in-patient in a NSW public hospital in the last 2 years**, we would like you to participate in our solution testing, drawing on your experience to provide feedback, good or bad.

What does this mean for me?

As a recent public hospital in-patient who has low vision or is blind, you will contribute to the content and format of the resource for patients and health professionals. Involvement opportunities currently include either joining a **90-minute focus group** with up to six other participants or joining a **90-minute one-to-one discussion**. Confidentiality will be maintained with your feedback. It will be used to further develop and improve the final resource.

Sessions are between **October 19 to 30, 2020**. If you are interested in joining virtually you will require access to a computer with a working microphone and camera. Alternative participation options may become available. This is a voluntary position.
