Diagnostic services include:

- Humphrey field tests

- Orthoptic assessment of ocular motility conditions, binocular vision, diplopia and symptoms of eye strain
- Colour vision assessment
- Bjerrum screening
- Tensilon tests
- Pentacam
- Endothelial cell count

Other procedures and investigations include:

- A and B scan
- Keratometry (measurement of the curvature and diameter of the cornea for diagnostic purposes)
