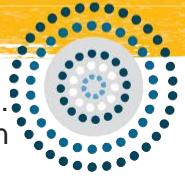


## Information for transitioning to Botulinum Toxin – Adult Service at Wagga Wagga Base Hospital in Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD)

Drs Louis Baggio and Rachael McQueen provide weekly outpatient clinics for people in the MLHD. Expertise can be provided to people needing spasticity management: including botulinum toxin injections post stroke, cerebral palsy or neurological conditions or the need for intrathecal pumps.

### When is the clinic?

- People are booked in as required. There is no spasticity clinic as such, but the majority of injections are completed on a Tuesday (Rehabilitation outpatient clinic).

- Any individual with spasticity of any cause who requires Botulinum Toxin
- Age: 16 years old and above
- Lives within Murrumbidgee Local Health District but out of area accepted on a needs basis.

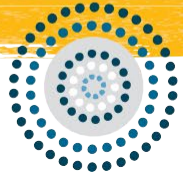

## Information for transitioning to Botulinum Toxin – Adult Service at Wagga Wagga Base Hospital

### Facilities available:

- Wheelchair accessible
- Hoist can be arranged
- Accessible toilet
- Accessible parking

### Who will you see?

- Rehabilitation specialist
- Rehabilitation registrar
- Referrals to Allied Health available

### What should you bring to your appointment?

- Medicare card
- A list of medications you are taking
- Recent pathology and imaging (x-rays)
- Reports from other specialists related to your spasticity or other healthcare providers (e.g. Neurologist)
- Usual gait aids, prosthesis/orthotics, hand splints/braces

The car park, located on the eastern side of campus with entry from Lewis Drive off Edward Street, will be unavailable from Monday 7 September 2020 as the Stage 3 construction zone is expanded to undertake car parking, footpath, paving and landscaping works.

Remaining car parking areas across the campus will be open and interim parking and pedestrian measures will be put in place including:

- Drop-off zones in front of the Emergency Department
- Additional public car parking spaces made available in the northern car park off Edward Street
- Additional accessible car parking made available in front of the Mental Health Unit
- An evening shuttle bus service to take staff on the afternoon shift to their vehicles in streets surrounding the campus
- Pedestrian access to the Hospital's temporary main entry will be relocated to the footpath on Lewis Drive.

Carpark: Limited on-site parking because of redevelopment (which will continue into 2022). Nearby street parking can be very limited, so best to be dropped off.
