Professor Lin Perry

PhD (Stroke Management, University of London), MSc in Healthcare (Management, University of Exeter), DipN, PGCert ED, RN (University of Plymouth).

Lin Perry is Professor of Nursing Research and Practice Development, University of Technology Sydney and South Eastern Sydney LHD Lin is a mixed-methods researcher with a strong international profile in implementation science service development and evaluation projects in Australia and the UK. Her areas of interest include chronic disease management, particularly osteoporosis, diabetes and stroke services, and safety and quality improvement.



Associate Professor Yvonne Zurynski

Yvonne Zurynski is the inaugural Associate Professor of Health System Sustainability at the Australian Institute of Health Innovation at Macquarie University. She is an expert in health services and systems research and implementation science. She is passionate about improving care for people living with chronic and complex health conditions through the development and evaluation of innovative integrated models of care. Her qualifications include a PhD in Medicine, a Masters in Health Policy, Masters in Applied Science and a Bachelor in Applied Science.



Dr Kaye Farrell

Dr. Kaye Farrell is a Clinical Nurse Consultant and co-ordinator of the multidisciplinary diabetes transition service, for patients aged 15-25 years, at Westmead Hospital, Sydney since 2004. Kaye's PhD thesis evaluated transition models of care, in particular the effectiveness of the Westmead Transition model. She has presented both nationally and internationally and has more than 15 publications, as first author and co-author, in international and national journals reporting on the diabetes outcomes in young adults after transition from paediatric to adult health services.
