


The Care of Confused Hospitalised Older Persons (CHOPs) Program aims to help you identify and treat older people presenting with confusion



>30% of older people present with or develop confusion during their admission, most commonly as a result of dementia and delirium

DID YOU KNOW ... ?

Poor prevention and management of confusion can lead to avoidable functional decline, increased morbidity and adverse events

1. Undertake cognitive screening

2. Delirium risk identification

3. Assessment of older people with confusion

4. Management of older people with confusion

5. Effective communication to enhance care

6. Staff education

7. Supportive care environments
