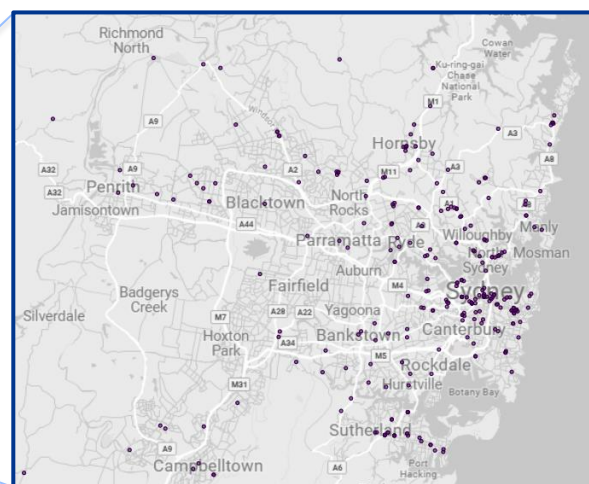
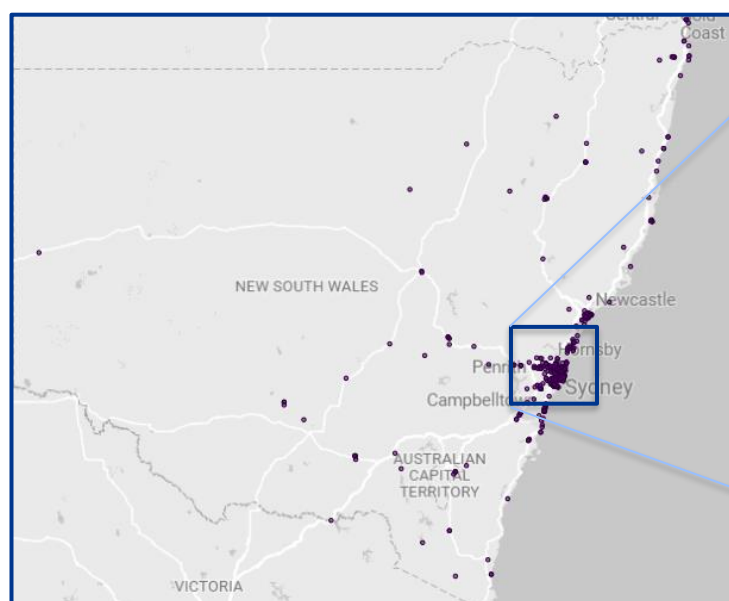

Communications and resources

- The Australasian ADHD Professionals Association (AADPA) in partnership with NSW Health has developed a [GP prescribing guide](#) available online at a subsidised cost.
- NSW Health is encouraging GPs to complete the requirements to become a continuation prescriber through several channels (emails, media events, through partners).

- Development of a process of registering general practices with continuation prescribers with [healthdirect's service finder](#), is underway.
- NSW Health's communications plan will occur in a phased implementation of key messages, audience engagement, and channel activation. This approach allows flexibility to adapt to system capacity and readiness while maintaining clarity and consistency in promoting ADHD reforms to the community and GPs.

Data is from NSW Health and SafeScript NSW. Prescribers who are flagged as continuation prescribers in SafeScript may have issued a Schedule 8 psychostimulant medicine through the individual patient approval pathway, including for conditions other than attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD). This is likely to cause a small overestimation of the number of people issued a prescription by a GP continuation prescriber for ADHD. Psychostimulant medicines such as dexamfetamine may be used in the treatment of conditions other than ADHD, including sleep disorders.
