## Handy tips for taking photos of the client in a wheelchair

## "A picture paints a thousand words"

Photos should be taken in 3 perspectives to give a comprehensive representation of the seating and wheeled mobility system:

- > from the side
- > from the front
- > from the back

Additional photos should be taken **from above** if client is presented with trunk rotation, pelvic rotation, wind swept posture, and asymmetrical head positioning.

**Zoom** in on areas where special attention to details is required. For example, broken components such as armrest, condition of the cushion without the cover

**Squat** down to take photos levelled with the client's hips down to give better elevation perspective and size proportion in the photos.

Remember, a good photo needs good lighting and contrasting backgrounds.

<u>Optional</u>: insert photos into a Word document. Highlight areas of concerns with labels or hand written notes. If required, this information can be used in referrals or funding submission report with the client's consent.
