<b>Discuss the indications for conscious / procedural sedation</b> <b>Expected Response</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Reduce anxiety related to the procedure</li> <li>• To minimise pain of invasive procedures</li> <li>• Reduce memory of procedure</li> </ul>									
<b>Preparation</b> <b>Expected Observation</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ensures that consent for procedure and/or sedation is complete.</li> <li>• Ensure correct procedure /correct site/ time out attended (unless emergent procedure)</li> <li>• Demonstrates correct set-up of monitoring equipment</li> <li>• Knows location of the emergency equipment and how to summon emergency assistance.</li> </ul>									
<b>Nursing Management during procedure</b> <b>Expected Observation</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Administers medications as per Central Coast Health policy and procedure</li> <li>• Monitor the patient's level of consciousness (AVPU) and cardio respiratory status.</li> <li>• Assesses total patient care requirements during sedation and recovery.</li> <li>• Anticipates and recognizes potential complications and intervenes appropriately in relation to the type of medication being administered.</li> <li>• Demonstrates how to document patient's response to sedation/ analgesia.</li> </ul>
