

# Is my child's rehabilitation care coordinated?

## Checklists for families

Rehabilitation involves the delivery of care by a multidisciplinary team. You and your child are the most important members of the team. These checklists will help you determine if there are any areas where further communication with the team may be needed.

When my child is staying in hospital for rehabilitation

I know who to contact when I have a question about my child's rehabilitation program				
I am involved in goal setting for my child's rehabilitation program				
I am given a weekly update about my child's progress				
The rehabilitation team have talked to us about whether rehabilitation is available closer to home. I understand why this may or may not be an option for us				
I am involved in decision making about my child's rehabilitation program				
If it is planned that we will move closer to home for rehabilitation, I know what needs to occur before this move can take place, including goals that need to be achieved				
Any new teams of therapists know about my child, their goals and what has happened during our hospital stay				
I was given a copy of the rehabilitation team discharge summary on the day we left hospital				
My child's school and/or teacher has been contacted by a member of the team to talk about going back to school and what is needed				



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<b>When my child is attending the outpatient clinic for rehabilitation</b>

<b>For initial appointment only</b> I was contacted by the rehabilitation service				
<b>For initial appointment only</b> When I was contacted, I was given information about the rehabilitation services available for my child

After attending our appointment, I received a copy of my child’s rehabilitation clinic report and/or letter from the rehabilitation doctor				
I received the report and/or letter no more than two weeks after the appointment				
<b>Copies of the doctor’s report and/or letter from clinic were also sent to my child’s:</b>				
general practitioner (GP)				
local care team				
other specialists				
I was offered the opportunity to have our local therapists and/or care team attend the rehabilitation clinic appointment, either in person or via video call

The ‘initial’ appointment is the very first appointment you have with the Paediatric Rehabilitation Service.
