#### **AUTHORITY**

I, Susan Pearce, Secretary, NSW Health, pursuant to sections 10(2)(b) and 10(4)(d) of the Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Act 1966; clauses 17, 53, 100, 170 and 171 of the Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Regulation 2008; and section 25(4)(a) of the Drug Misuse and Trafficking Act 1985 hereby make this instrument.

Authority to supply (by way of administration) poisons, restricted substances, and drugs of addiction

## 1) Authorisation

This instrument authorises an *authorised registered nurse* and *authorised enrolled nurse* to supply (by way of administration) a person with a poison, restricted substance, or drug of addiction (collectively 'the substance').

#### 2) Substances to which this instrument applies

This instrument applies to:

- a. specified poisons, namely scheduled substances listed in Schedule 2 or Schedule 3 of the Poisons Standard
- b. restricted substances; and
- c. drugs of addiction.

#### 3) Conditions — Limitation on supply (by way of administration)

## Authorised registered nurse

- a. The authorised registered nurse must be employed or engaged at a specified NSW Health entity and administer the substance in the course of their employment or engagement with that entity.
- b. The authorised registered nurse must have successfully completed the required education and training to select, initiate, and administer

- medication set out in the Use of Emergency Care Assessment and Treatment (ECAT) Protocols and Policy Directive.
- c. The authorised registered nurse must only administer the substance in accordance with the ECAT Protocols and Policy Directive.
- d. The authorised registered nurse must maintain proficiency in current practices relating to the substances referred to in the ECAT Protocols.

### <u>Authorised enrolled nurse</u>

- (a) The authorised enrolled nurse must only administer the substance under the supervision of an authorised registered nurse.
- (b) The authorised enrolled nurse must not initiate the substance to a person.
- (c) The authorised enrolled nurse must be employed or engaged at a specified NSW Health entity and administer the substance in the course of their employment or engagement with that entity.
- (d) The authorised enrolled nurse must have successfully completed the required education and training as set out in the ECAT Protocols and Policy Directive.
- (e) The authorised enrolled nurse must only administer the substance in accordance with the ECAT Protocols and Policy Directive, including to only use the unshaded portions of the ECAT Protocols.
- (f) The authorised enrolled nurse must maintain proficiency in current practices relating to the substances referred to in the ECAT Protocols.

### 4) Publication

This instrument is to be published on the NSW Health website.

#### 5) Definitions

In this instrument:

- Poisons standard, poison, restricted substance, and drug of addiction have the same meaning as in the Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Act 1966.
- Authorised registered nurse means a registered nurse who:
  - i. is employed or engaged in a specified NSW Health entity; and
  - ii. has successfully completed the required education and training as set out in the Use of ECAT Protocols and Policy Directive.
- Authorised enrolled nurse means an enrolled nurse who:
  - i. is employed or engaged in a specified NSW Health entity; and
  - ii. has successfully completed the required education and training as set out in the Use of ECAT Protocols and Policy Directive.
- specified NSW Health entity means:
  - i. a Local Health District, including a hospital controlled by a Local Health District
  - ii. a hospital controlled by the Crown (including the Minister or the Health Administration Corporation)
  - iii. a specified affiliated health organisation, namely:
    - St Vincent's Hospital Sydney Limited; or
  - iv. a specified statutory health corporation, namely:

- The Sydney Children's Hospitals Network (Randwick and Westmead) (incorporating The Royal Alexandra Hospital for Children).
- affiliated health organisation, Local Health District, and statutory health corporation have the same meaning as in the Health Services Act 1997 (NSW).

# 6) Commencement

This authority commences on publication.

# 7) Cancellation

This authority remains in effect for 24 months after signature, unless earlier cancelled.
